
standardized and kept uniform for all distribution licensees in the State, and what terms & conditions can be kept flexible and can have differences based on their operations and financial needs.


Those terms & conditions which are to be kept uniform across all distribution licensees can be incorporated in the JSERC (Electricity Supply Code) Regulations, 2015, itself and need not be written in individual tariff orders.

Therefore, it was decided to discuss the whole issue in Electricity Supply Code Review Panel constituted under Clause 1.6 of the JSERC (Electricity Supply Code) Regulations, 2015.

The office is directed to organize a meeting of Electricity Supply Code Review Panel within 45 days and the issue regarding terms & conditions of supply may be incorporated in the agenda item.

With the above directions, the review petition is disposed of, accordingly.
